Pastor's Letter



First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed throughout all the world. Romans 1:8

Dear Friends:

As we look toward September and the beginning of another "Activity Year," these words of greeting to the church in Rome- these words of thanksgiving for their partnership in ministry- are words that convey my thoughts about you at this time. I cannot remember a more exciting "New Year" beginning than this one.

First, we have "God's Work, Our Hands" on Sunday, September 7th. What a great celebration and experience that day is going to be! At the one service (9:30), we'll have the Blessing of the Backpacks and School Students, the Blessing of All Educators, and the Installation of the Sunday School Staff. Following the liturgy, we'll leave the building and go to one of four service projects where we will do "God's work" with "our hands." This will be a witness for the church serving the community. The service projects include cleaning up South Ardmore Park, sprucing up our cemetery, filling Aid for Friends food trays, and packing toiletries for the Delaware Life Center. After our projects, we'll all come back to the church lawn for our annual picnic.

In Paul's words, "I thank my God through Jesus Christ for all of you, because your faith is proclaimed throughout all the world."

The other news that has me excited as we begin this "New Year" is the potential pending call of a new Associate Pastor. This call follows nearly three years of process. It all began when church council brought in an expert in strategic planning in May of 2012. One of the three areas we zeroed in on was Increased Pastoral Resources. A congregational survey was done in which calling a second pastor was overwhelmingly suggested by respondents.

Our "Building on Blessings" campaign was established largely to meet this need. I am so personally grateful for all who responded to this opportunity. And I want to assure you that you can still do so!

Last month we wrote about two of the Building on Blessings aspirations (1) to raise at least \$500,000 so that we could increase pastoral resources and benevolence and plan for future building maintenance, and (2) to have every member of St. Paul's contribute to the campaign. This month we have good news on a third goal of our campaign: to grow the Endowment Fund.

A major impetus to starting the Building on Blessings campaign was a concern that our reliance on the Endowment Fund to get us through some lean years would soon cause it to be depleted. Created and grown through the generosity of many St. Paul's members, the Endowment Fund was established with the hope that it would provide long-time financial support by providing income on an annual basis and capital on an as needed basis.

We are delighted to report that the history of generosity of our members continues with a large gift from the estate of Wenner Smith. Wenner and his wife Cynthia were long time active members of St. Paul's whose commitment to St. Paul's caused them to make a \$200,000 gift. Wenner's and Cynthia's generosity, along with that of the many past contributors to our Endowment Fund, is a reminder to us all how important this fund is to our sustainability and our need to preserve and grow it so it can provide support to our ministry for many years to come. Our Building on Blessings campaign will do just that. We hope you will consider making a pledge by October 1, 2014.




We will continue the First Sunday celebrations (the first Sunday of each month) with family worship at 9:00, in a service designed with children in mind.
