Dear Friends:

Every year when I sit down to write my June Chimes article, I find myself thinking about the young people in this congregation. Perhaps that is because I am always working on worship for Vacation Bible School at this time of year. Our VBS theme this year is *Everest: Conquering Challenges with God's Mighty Power!* Everest VBS will be held June 22-26. As I've said many times, this is one of my favorite weeks of the year!

So for my message this month, I wanted to share with you each of the daily "Bible Points" for the five days of our journey. Each Point is connected to a biblical story. All are about how God helps us overcome obstacles and difficult journeys.

God has the power to provide... Monday we will see how God provides for us no matter what the need, no matter what the obstacle. Today our Bible Expedition will show us how God provided of Elijah under the broomtree.
